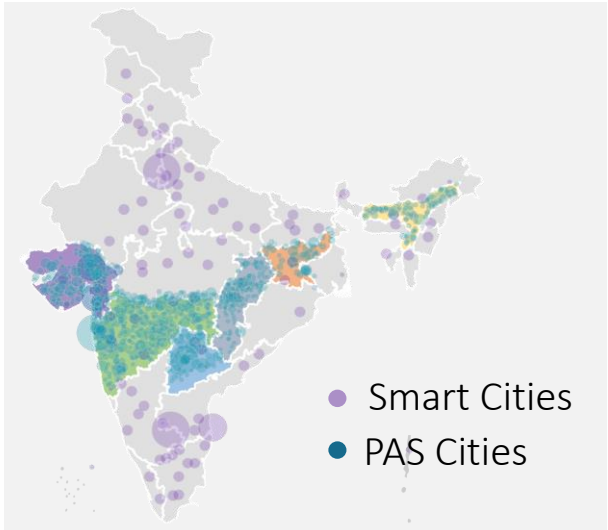

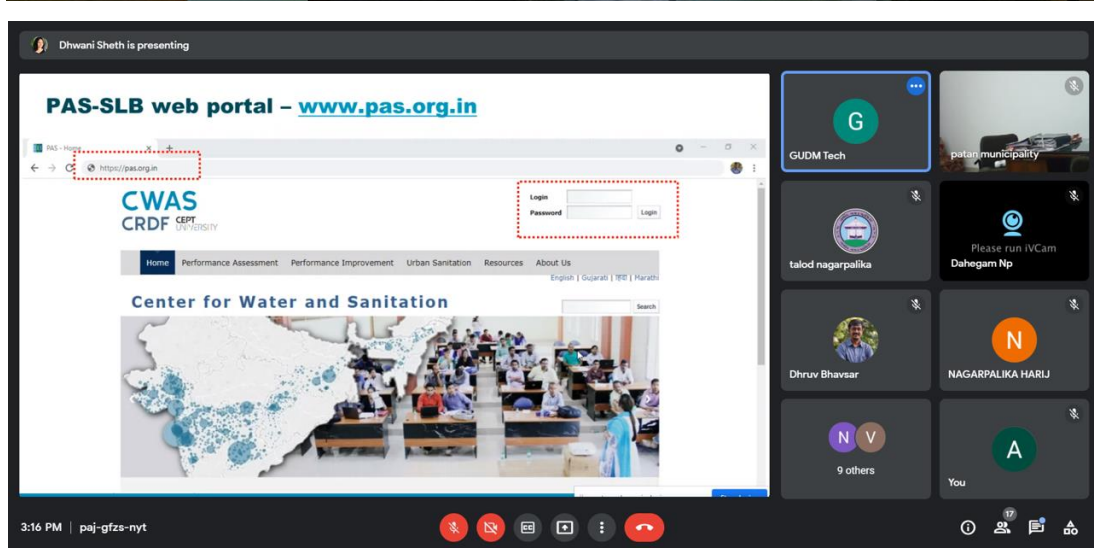

Capacity Building For Improving Sanitation and Solid Waste Management Services

CWAS, in partnership with HDFC Bank, is conducting capacity-building activities on Water Secure Villages and SWM under the "Parivartan" CSR initiative, with pilot projects in Palghar district, Maharashtra. Additionally, in collaboration with GCCI and Gandhidham Municipal Council, CWAS organized the "Jal Sanrakshan Mela" on July 20-21, 2024, at GCCI, Gandhidham, bringing together RWH, GWR service providers, and stakeholders.

In 2023, CWAS in partnership with Urban Management Center (UMC) have been empaneled as a Swachhata Knowledge Partner to Government of Gujarat for conducting capacity building trainings on sanitation and solid waste management (SWM) under SBM 2.0.

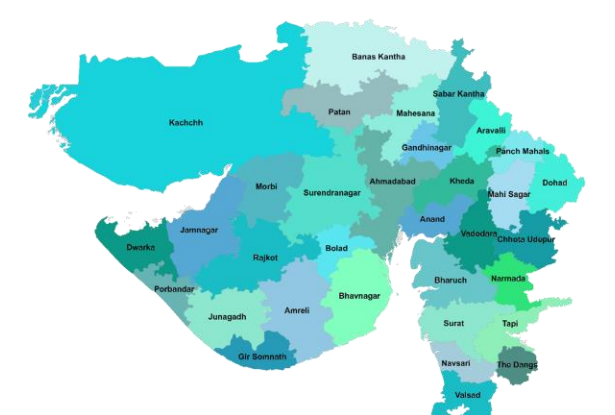
