DISPARITY EXISTS

Access has improved in metro cities (77%), but remains the same in smaller cities (58%). Within cities there is a wide disparity in services to slum dwellers (50% vs 64% in city)

The majority of cities supply water for **LESS THAN 4 HOURS A DAY**

The **AVERAGE** citizen receives **114 LPCD** but more than **40% CITIES** supply less than **70 LPCD**

National programmes for improving water services

National Infrastructure

Pipeline ... Rs 100 lakh crore investment with emphasis on ease of living including safe drinking water component

Fifteenth Finance

Commission ... mandates that cities use 50% of their grants for improved water and sanitation services



Jal Shakti Abhiyan

...for augmenting local water sources, recharging existing sources, promoting water harvesting and de-salination



Jal Jeevan Mission

... 3.6 lakh crores to provide Functional Household Tap Connection to every rural household or by 2024 - Har Ghar Nal Se Jal



National Mission for Clean Ganga

...for abatement of pollution and rejuvenation of the Ganga river basin



Swachh Bharat Mission

... latest monitoring protocols require cities to fully treat their waste and reuse it



AMRUT mission

...for urban revival projects in water supply and sanitation infrastructure



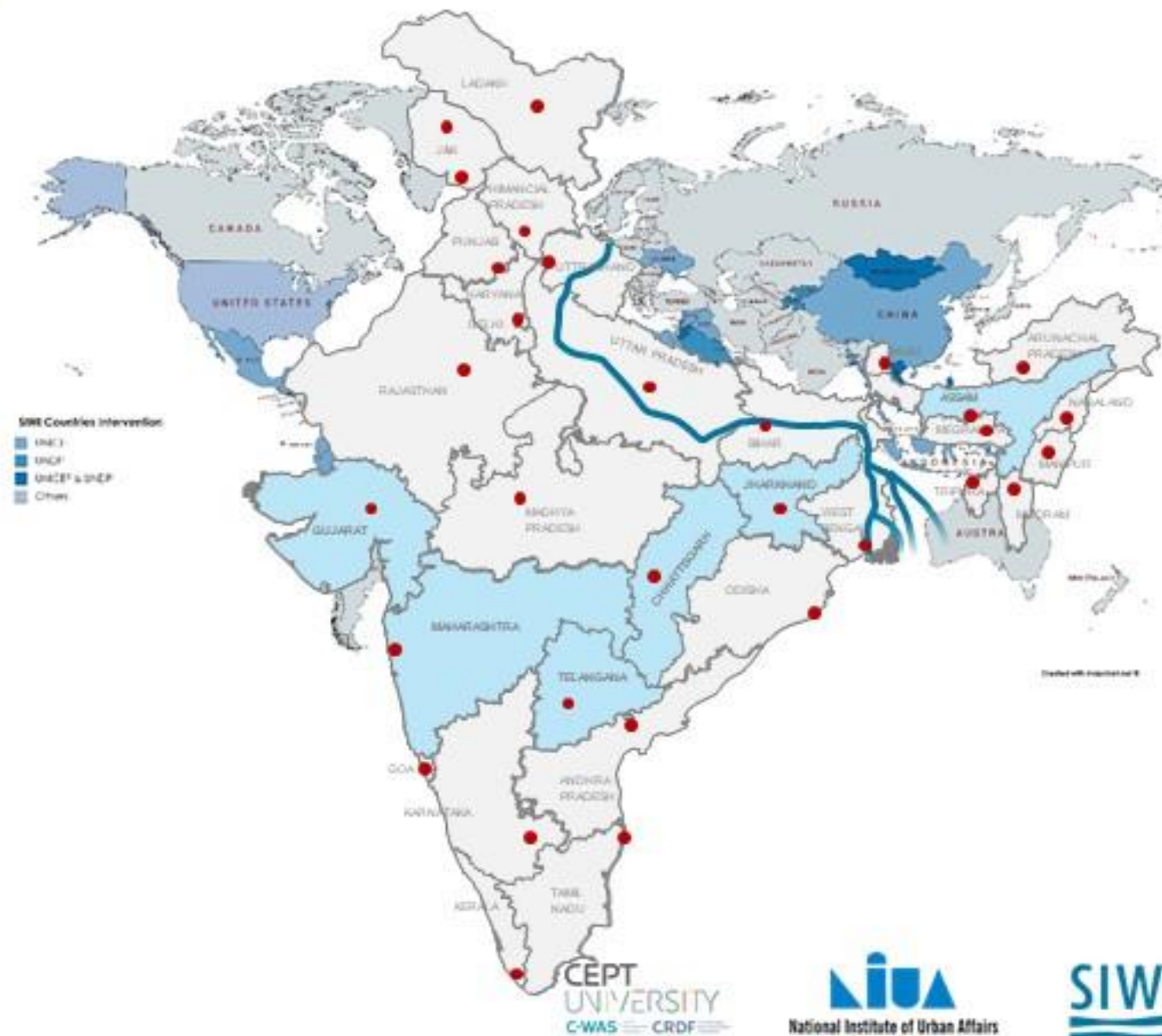

... for improving quality of life in 100 cities by harnessing technology.

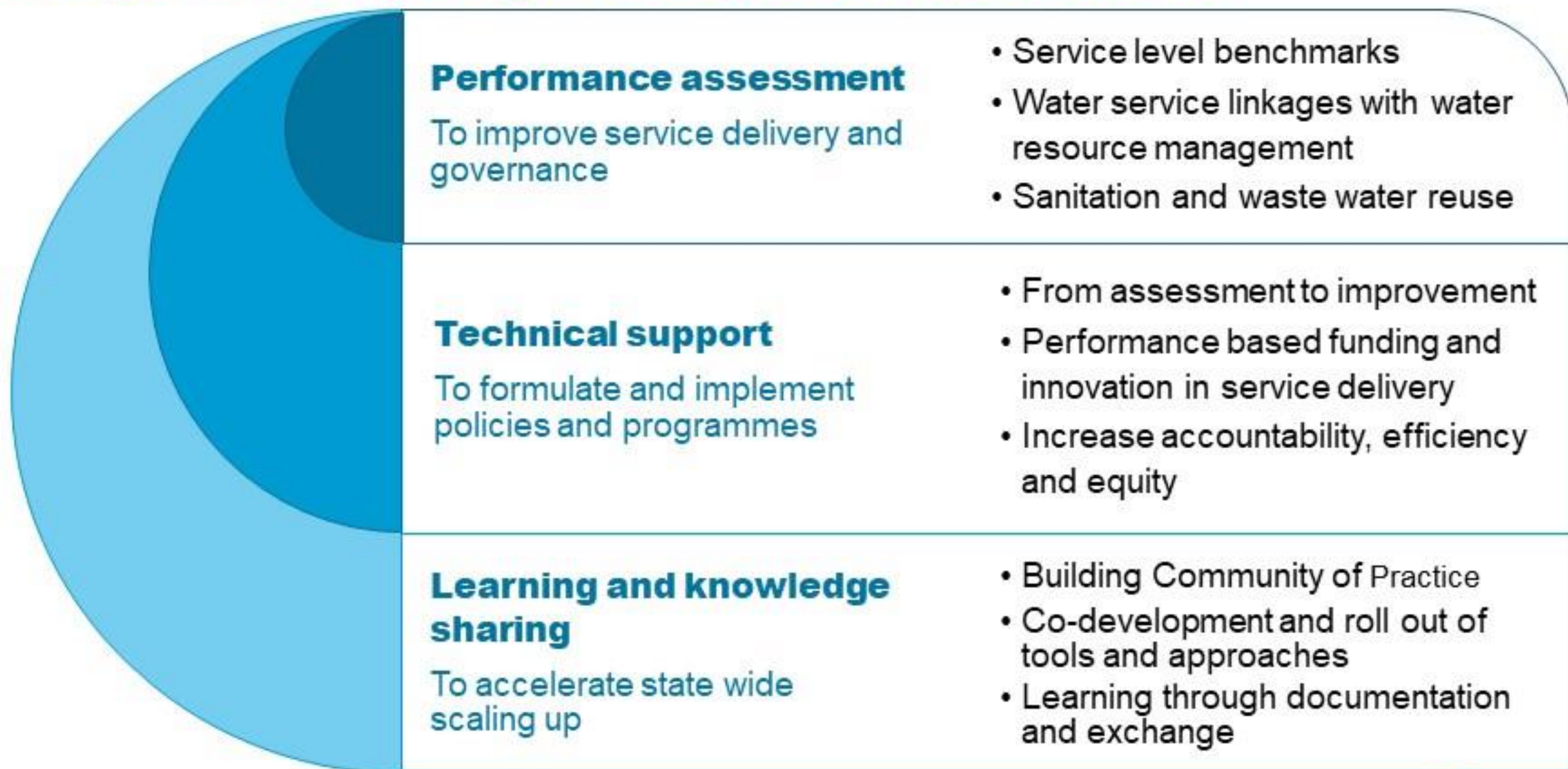
